Coaching Season Summary

What a season!!! We have had our ups and downs across the junior sections but there is a lot to show we are going in the right direction. The performances on the field showed we are in good shape to withstand most others through at us: grading changes, playing at the highest levels in all ages except one and mid-winter flu taking down so many. It is important not to compare this season with last year as player changes each year. We are improving across the juniors on the two year cycle of the Hockey Victoria age groups. Example U17A grade were playing U15PA two years ago. U15A grade played U13PA.

Highlights are not just the three flags in U13's and U11's but the way so many players improved over the season and really showed how well they could play by season end. It was good to see all girls teams, except one reached the finals, which is our best result as a club. The U13's, U11's and U9's are starting to show the rest of the competitions we are a real force to reckon with.

If you just reviewed the results of some grades you do not get a clear picture of what went on in the different age groups. We started the season with the shock that HV had removed all Pennant South grades to "improve hockey". This decision directly affected our 2nd teams in all age groups.

Our U17 mixed group were affected by players not continuing with us in 2009 due to the lack of PS grade and some going back to their original clubs. We still performed well in all grades without dominating as in 2008. It has been very pleasing to see so many of the U17 boys and girls playing in the senior section this year. Some even experienced top grade hockey in State league 1 and Women's State league 2. Congratulations to our Madeline Wilson who has won Hockey Victoria's Fiona Hodges Award. This is awarded to the best and fairest female player, playing in the U17 girls division. We are proud of Madeline on winning this prestigious award. It must be noted this is the second year running a player from Southern United has won this award.

We were especially affected in U15's where our mixed teams either had the option to play in grades, either too high or too low for our skill level. We chose the higher standard which meant sometimes we were out gunned by some superior opposition. The players did not drop their heads and will be better for the experience next year. Many of this group and many girls also ventured into senior hockey and have shown great improvement through the year.

Our Under 13's age group has been the engine room of the club this year with 3 out of the 5 sides in finals with 2 flags to show for it. It is an age where the fun of hockey takes shape into a team game. This can be hard as we have welcomed many new players to this grade. The coaches and players should be commended this year for a great job and next year will be even better.
