Season Summary

What a season!!! We have had our ups and downs across the junior sections but there is a lot to show we are going in the right direction. The performances on the field showed we are in good shape to withstand what most others throw at us: grading changes, playing at the highest levels. It is important not to compare this season with last year as players change each year. We are improving across the juniors on the two year Hockey Victoria age groups cycle.

Highlights are not just the two flags in U15's and U11's but the way so many players improved over the season and really showed how well they could play by season end, Some coaches said if the season was another 6 games some teams positions would have changed. The U11's and U9's are starting to show the rest of the competitions we are a real force to be reckoned with all three U11's in the finals and U9's topping of their grade. Saying that, if you just reviewed the results of some grades you don't get a clear picture of what went on in the different age groups. We are still dealing with HV removing all Pennant South grades to "improve hockey". This decision directly affects our 2nd teams in all age groups. We have been playing against several strong 1st teams from other clubs. Our U11PSE team's performance shows the depth of the group

Our U17 mixed group started the season with several player changes from the same teams in 2008 (the HV two year cycle) due to players from our U15A team leaving to play at Mentone. The whole player group took this in their stride and performed well. The club is finding so much change in the U17 age group with so many other interests, school commitments and events taking more of our juniors time. The Girls felt this hard all year. All teams finished the season with a solid base for a good 2011 season. This is the first year the clubs see a larger number of players completing the junior careers – they now have an opportunity to continue within our senior sections.

Our U15's age group started the year with good numbers for four mixed teams and the numbers only improved as the season went on. The Girls had too many for 1 team and too few for 2 so the committee ask if several players could play up into the U17GD team. The Girls did really well to finish 2nd behind a really strong Mentone improving on 2 years ago.

Through injury and unavailable players, we were rarely at full strength in the Shield team which was reflected in the results. As a group, they were competitive all season having some great results against the top teams. Our Pennant South East team didn't reach their full potential for several different reasons which are only pertinent to this season. The main group will change in structure for this team and that will only be a benefit as there was disharmony in the later rounds that were reflected in the results. The two South teams had very good seasons with the premiership being won by South 1. The group was a very good group that responded well to direction as the results showed. The main areas of improvement would have achievable if there were more people available for the coaching roles. Having continuity from training to game nights and back to training would have been much more desirable. All in all, a very good group of kids that appeared to enjoy their hockey and seemed to be listening to the coaching and applying what they could.

Our U13's age group was faced with the situation at the start of this season with either having three teams in south and one in PSE which we would dominate or playing A, PSE and 2 South teams. The Coaching group after looking at all the pro's and con's of both, decided to go with the latter. We also had only just enough Girl who wanted to play on Saturday morning to run the U13 GA team. Numbers and depth of our squads was our Achilles heel. When we had several players away during the season our teams struggle against some very good opposition in all the

grades. This was a young group who have learnt so much about what is needed to perform and 2011 will be a stronger year.

Our U11's – well, words like amazing and awesome could be used. You ask why. The three teams we entered in to A, PSE and South all featured in finals. The A's only going down to a strong Altona in the GF, the South Grade, winners of the big one and the PSE unlucky not to advance to the grand final, drawing in the semi with the top side. All the players really showed how much they enjoyed hockey while developing some good basic skills. We welcomed many new players into this age group and built on many U9's great season's from 2009.

Finally our U9's have shown great promise. After marrying coaches with training location the U9's have gone from strength to strength with so many stars to mention. Some U9's had to play in U11's grade as they had out grown the smaller field of U9's. The focus on skills in action really showed with so many new players developing so quickly over the year. The club will continue to work hard to support this most important age group with our Minky program in 2011 and working with HV to improve the competition set up.

The club has been working hard behind the scenes in 2010 to develop ways we can improve all players in every grade. We were lucky this year to secure the services of John Mowat (ex VIS head coach) to run a "coach the coaches" program for all our junior coaches. This was coordinated by Ross Walker. It was a great success, with all coaches exposed to the top level methodologies on how to impart skills to all players.

Last year we started our Mckenzie's Skills Clinic series and we will continue this in October and November this year. We had just under 100 juniors attend this 6 week clinic and hope for a similar up take this year. Travis Brooks was our inaugural lead coach. This year we have secured Malcolm Kemp, current Australian youth team member and an ex-founding club member. We are grateful for our sponsors Mckenzie's Foods support, which has made this possible.

As a club one of our goals is to be a premier SL1 club by 2015 while still being able to offer all levels to our members. To this end we have now introduced the SUHA program aimed at preparing our players for the higher level needed to perform in HV top grades. Due the quality of the response from the membership the club is also developing a further program for the players who were not part of the first intake based on the same methodology.

When you step back and look at what we are now running – GK coaching, out of season coaching clinics (Mckenzie's), SUHA, the extra development group and Coaches development the level of hockey across the junior and therefore senior sections should improve year on year.

Finally - Sharks (State Championship Competition for U13, 15 and 17's)

This year HV introduced a new zonal grouping for the State championships. Depending on how you look at the changes we will be better or worse off. On the positive side more of our players now have an opportunity to play at a rep level and receive further coaching as well as not having to worry about having our players being poached. On the negative side our region is weaker as we are now the only SL1 and A grade Junior club in the zone. The new zonal structures have created imbalances which were evident at the championships in all age groups. I think we use this change as a positive using it as a way for more of our juniors to be exposed to top competition. Our U17 boys representative just finished their competition this weeked with all 4 performing really well, helping the team to 3rd place.

Under 9's Silver

Coaching Under 9's is a unique experience and I encourage you to look for the opportunity to get involved with a team at this level.

Where else can you get enjoyment from seeing a player score their first goal, have their first win or look forward to singing the song and getting confused when you do not sing it after a loss?

There are other good experiences like seeing players skip after the ball (instead of running), run towards their best friend when the friend is dribbling with the ball (running into him or her and giving possession to the opposition), dribbling around in circles during the game (because that is what you did at training), drawing pictures in the sand (when the game gets boring), taking in the scenery or forming new relationships (chatting with your team mate or even the opposition about what they are doing on their birthday or what is the name of that bird).

Whilst I may have seen all these things this year coaching Under 9 Silver, the best thing from the coach's perspective is seeing improvement in the hockey being played at the individual and team levels and the smiles on the faces from having a good time.

This year a few of our players scored their first goals (including Will McNess, Kurtis Langeder & Emily Butler). People took on new roles (Owen Vorrath taking on centre half, Michael Birkett moving out of full back up to half back). Our passing got stronger as the year went on which meant players got involved in good structure, maintaining possession and switching the play (Kate McNess, Ethan Vaserman, Maia O'Connor & Brodie Jensen), no better than our big 9-1 win against Frankston. Others got recognised by opposition teams and spectators for their great skill, control and scoring (Mark Edwards with 17 goals from centre forward and Nicola Brooks 10 goals from right wing including one in the top corner and another runaway solo effort from half back – sorry for the detail, this is a proud dad writing).

I hope to see the team continue to develop through their years of hockey with Southern United like others I have coached (and they will know when I am watching because of the free advice).

Under 9's Black

This was a season memorable for the amazing spirit amongst the team, parent group, coaches and managers. I haven't previously seen such consistent commitment to supporting a team by both players and their parents at any level or age. It was rare not to have every family represented at each game by both player and one or more parents, with all families present at every social event.

A huge thanks to the **2010 Joint Team Managers of the Year** Anna and John Pease, who made life for everybody, in particular the three coaches, an absolute breeze. My joint coaches **Peter Paice** and **Ken Walker** should be proud of the significant impact they've had on the sporting pursuits of a group of talented and aspiring young hockey players. Thank you Peter and Ken for your efforts in developing both the technical aspect of the boys' games and nurturing a learning environment enjoyable to all. A big thank you also to **Phoebe Willcock** (under 9 Red coach), together with **Donny Fernandez** and **Tom and Liam Wegner** for their regular assistance in coaching the boys at training throughout the course of the season.

At the beginning of the season I recall pointing out to the parents in an email that the first objective was for the kids to enjoy the experience, the second, for them to learn something, and if both of those things could be achieved, then having some success would top it off. Undoubtedly, due to the collective effort of the extended team of players, parents, managers and coaches, we managed to achieve all three objectives.

The majority of the team had not played any hockey prior to this season and the on-field performance of the team and fast track development of those new players can be put down in large part to the way the few experienced players involved, engaged and embraced the new boys both on and off field so quickly. Credit in this regard to 'old hands' Andre Fernandez, Christian van der Merwe, James Chilcott and Davin Walker.

Of the new chums, our little pocket rocket **Lachy Paice** who turned 6 late in the season showed skill, courage and determination beyond his years. **Will Garbolotto** (age 6) demonstrated enormous athleticism and potential. If he chooses to put in the practice he could well achieve that potential.

Rylan Pease (age 7) proved that practice makes perfect in developing extremely good tight ball control. He just needs to believe that he is as good as we all know he can be.

Cristian Camillo scored more than his fair share of goals for a first year player and proved that he could perform at both ends of the ground. **Leon Glatz** demonstrated the legendary powers of German concentration and became an extremely competent and effective player in all positions during his first season, improving his skills significantly over the 18 weeks.

Of those that had played previously, 'veteran' **James Chilcott** really came of age late in the season showing great leadership in lifting his team to a win in a game where the opposition had outplayed us for the first 50 minutes. **Christian van der Merwe** and **Andre Fernandez** both made very significant improvement on the previous year becoming more team focused and improving their close ball control. **Davin Walker** was untiring and industrious all year and continued to develop his skills, in particular his ability to take on the opposition. Only 3 players are ineligible to play under 9 again in 2011. We wish **Leon, Cristian Camillo and James** all the best in moving onto the 'big ground'. Six year olds **Lachy** and **Will** together with 7 year old **Rylan** are eligible again for under 9's next year and we wish them and their coach **Peter Paice** the best of luck.

Andre and Christian van der Merwe are eligible to play under 9 again in 2011, whilst Davin is eligible for another 2 years. However it is likely that these three boys will play under 11's which will be a terrific challenge for them all, but one I'm sure they will enjoy.

In all, a very enjoyable season for myself and I suspect all involved. Thanks everyone.

This was consistently exemplified by their hard running and perseverance, regardless of the score-line. We began the season conceding 14 goals in the first two games; a less than ideal start.
