Season Summary

The year has been a big year for the junior section with 22 teams playing, the largest number of teams for some years. The highlight of the year was the number of new players to hockey with 100 players joining the junior section in 2015.

The results of the junior teams have also been strong, with the results not fully reflecting the hard work and enjoyment of the game.

With nine teams in to junior finals, the success has been there. Together with the nine teams in finals, quite a few teams have made a last run to the end of the season, if the season was back to eighteen rounds, things could have been different.

Four shield premierships is the greatest A grade success the club has had since its merger in 2006. This is a great achievement for all, showing the results of the hard work of not only the players but coaches and initiatives of the club such as the Southern United Hockey Academy.

In the under 10s, the under 10 black team had an undefeated season. Made up of the boys who were to train at Dendy St, their success has been outstanding. 2015 also saw Southern entering an under 10 girls team for the first time. The girls, all quite young, worked hard under the coaching of Lisa Carruthers, and the future for our girls hockey bodes well. The under 10 silver team, had a strong finish to their season winning eight of their last nine games, while the under 10 red team, made up of many very young children will continue to grow.

The under 12s have had a stellar season, with five of the six teams making finals. The under 12 Girls A team were unbeaten, while the under 12 girls pennant team, with girls who were juggling sporting commitments on Saturday morning played well for many first timers, also making the finals. The under 12 mixed A team played strong hockey throughout the season only being beaten by Camberwell and Doncaster. The win in the semi final and grand final against those teams showed how much the team has improved over the year.

The Under 12 pennant while being played around with Hockey Victoria fixtures had a very strong season finished third on the ladder, and then just so close in the grand final to finish as runners up. The two south teams, were picked to be even teams, and even they were, with the two head to head matches having a different winner each match. The under 12 red team drew the hard draw playing Mentone three times, but still came away with second place on the ladder, while the black team just missed out on the four.

The under 14s had a tough year. With six teams in under 14 the numbers were light overall, and it seems that the dreaded flu and other lurgies were out to get our players.

The under 14 girls started the season with light numbers, and when injuries and a few no shows happened it looked like the second team would need to fold. But with some great friendship groups, the under 14 girls pennant team, encouraged more to join, and with the wonderful coaching and support of Phoebe Willcock the under 14 girls pennant team finished the season strong, only just missing the top four. The under 14 shield girls did continue to struggle with injury and other sporting commitments. Their place on the ladder does not reflect the skills and teamwork of these girls.

The under 14 mixed A team, like the under 12 mixed A team, were only beaten by two teams for the season, Camberwell and Essendon, finishing the season in third. The under 14 pennant team, with three new players to club hockey, improved as the season progressed, but playing many first teams for strong clubs like Doncaster and Kew could not get the results they would have liked. The two under 14 south teams, coached by young coaches determined to show which were stronger both had a fun season, with the red team just missing the top four. Position four, five and six on the ladder all finishing on the same points.

The under 16 shield girls and mixed teams both finished in the top four, and then showed their true resilience moving from 3rd and 2nd on the ladder to premiers. For many of these children it is their last year of "juniors" and some have been playing in juniors at Southern since they were 6 or 7. With competing sporting commitments of players at this age, it can be challenging. Six of the under 16s were out for two weeks with State commitments which makes it challenging for all teams. Even with these challenge the under 16 mixed pennant team finished in fifth place, a great achievement, two years ago Southern did not have a matching under 14 pennant team. The under 16 south team also finished the season with some goods wins. The under 16 pennant girls had a very tough competition with fifteen teams in the competition ranging from Geelong to Ballarat to Greensborough to Mornington. Despite the challenges of distance and times, the team as always played and had fun.

The under 18 competition was introduced in 2015 to provide a stepping stone between juniors and seniors hockey. Targeted at a pennant/district level, the competition has been great for these boys, and Emma. With Shantel Blake and John Leighton to keep them on track the team had great success finishing a strong second on the ladder, and unlucky to lose the grand final in a penalty shoot out.

The year also had various hook in 2 hockey programs that were available for new and young players. The start of the year saw forty children join the five week hook in 2 hockey. This gave children a feel for hockey, some of these children went on to join under 10 teams, while other continued with the weekly intra club program under the wonderful coaching of Warren Davey, and Marcus Moltzer.

The club elite players have also had a stellar season outside of club hockey. With forty three players selected to play in the Junior State Championships representative teams, and Southern Sharks winning championships for Under 17 girls and Under 13 boys our representative players have been showing great promise.

The club has also had thirty players represent the state in under age competition during 2015 in indoor and outdoor teams. While a few are senior players, they have progressed from our junior ranks and it is a testament to the quality of our junior program. Not only have players represented Victoria, Ash Bingle and Nathan Ephraums were selected for the Australian Futures squad, and Nathan Ephraums has also been selected in the School Sport Australia Under 16 team for next year, while Josh Mulder and Amy Lawton have been selected as shadow players. Players from Southern have also been selected in the elite Emerging and Junior Emerging Vikings and Vipers squad.

The club could not function without our umpires. Thanks to Sue Jones for the huge task in co-ordinating our umpires, thanks to all our umpires, and congratulations to Bill Campbell who received his HV umpiring badge this year.

The canteen and the shop are something we all expect to be there, and we often give it little thought. The work put in by Greg in the shop is continual, thanks Greg. For Tina and her band of canteen workers also a big thanks, a thanks to all the parents also who have completed their canteen/bbq duty.
