



Southern United Hockey Club President's 2018 Report

This year has been a huge success for Southern United. Our success this year is truly the result of the effort, planning, and direction that begun back in 2006 when Southern United was founded. And it is the result of the countless hours people have put in since then to create the club that is here today.

A few of the 2018 highlights from a whole of club perspective include:

1. The historic Men's Premier League Premiership.
2. Southern United was one of eight clubs Hockey Victoria appointed as a Change Our Game Ambassador Club. The purpose of this appointment is to identify and implement key strategies that drive cultural change within our Club to achieve greater gender equity. Our club will work closely with Hockey Victoria to pursue a number of key measures across Administration, Coaching, Umpiring and broader participation.
3. Raising close to \$10 000 for the Peter MacCallum Cancer Foundation. Over the years, led by Life Member Julian Pratt, SUHC has raised \$74 000 for the Peter MacCallum Cancer Foundation. In 2018, the Club was recognised for its fundraising efforts by its inclusion in the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre's Honour Board.
4. Turning the Club's attention to its Facility Strategy. Though development is slow, discussion about upgrading the Club's facilities has begun with Kingston City Council.

Going forward, I expect the Club to have continued success. However, to actualise that expectation, we need to continue to make decisions and deliver on our strategic objective: *SUHC will provide its members with the best possible opportunity to play and enjoy hockey on and off the field at all levels and be the club of first choice in the south eastern and bayside suburbs of Melbourne.*

This involves continuing to direct our Club's effort towards ensuring our Club provides the appropriate pathways for all our members to participate in hockey and within the Club, for example, by ensuring our Club meets its League Entry Criteria (LEC) for Hockey Victoria's Premier League competition and offering development opportunities for our coaches and umpires.

Our Club and its community are built on our volunteers. I am truly lucky to be able to see the work that goes on behind the scenes at our Club. Thank you to the tireless work of our Club's volunteers. In particular, thank you to the Social Club for organising inclusive and entertaining fundraising events for the Club. Thank you to each for the section committees for their work in getting teams on the pitch and much more. And finally, thank you to the Committee of Management, for its guidance and sound handling of the Club's strategic direction.

I anticipate 2019 will prove to be another successful year for the club on and off the field. I know we will work hard to continue to offer an inclusive community for all of our members.

Southern United Hockey club continued to provide an outstanding junior hockey program and experience through 2018. The program has been in place for a number of years and continues to provide success both on the field and through participation numbers.

On field success in the winter competition included the following;

- Premierships: U16 Mixed Shield, U16 Mixed Pennant, U14 Mixed Shield A
- Runners Up: U12 Girls Shield
- Minor Premierships: U16 Mixed Shield, U16 Mixed Pennant, U18 Mixed South East
- Finalists: U14 Mixed Pennant, U16 Girls Shield and U18 Mixed South East

This on field success also followed into the Indoor Competitions with

- Our U18 Girls winning the club championships
- Our U18 Boys and U15 Girls runners up in the club championships.

Southern United Hockey Club continues to produce junior players of high quality through various development programs, i.e. McKenzie's Skills Clinics, Southern United Hockey Academy, and goalie clinics. This is reflected in the number of SUHC players earning selection in regional and state outdoor and indoor teams. We had 56 players involved in various representative teams, 30 players in Victorian state teams, 6 players in national squads and teams. A great result for the club and we congratulate all of our representative players.

But more importantly, we have created an opportunity for young people to be part of healthy physical activity, engage in a team sport and develop skills and sportsmanship. We had 280 junior members in 2018 and also exposed around 1100 more to the sport of Hockey through School Visits and come and try sessions resulting in 65 children participating in Hin2 Hockey program.

An excellent committee comprised of parents who devote a lot of time and energy to run and coordinate our program of activities, identify coaches and managers. The committee do all of this in and around their work and family responsibilities and are also the first to volunteer when something needs doing. Throughout the 2018 year, we had a changeover of longer term committee members and new members. Thanks to all but a special thanks to retiring committee members Roger Arnold, Anna Jennings, Tracey Tingay-Smith, Julian Pratt, Allison Thomas, Warren Davey and Robyn Fitzgerald on their contributions over multiple seasons.

A great team of coaches. Our coaches, who also have study, jobs and life outside of hockey give up a couple of nights a week, for nearly half a year, to coach our players. It is a big task and a big responsibility to take charge of groups of 15-20 youngsters, and I would like to express the club's enormous gratitude to these volunteers – without coaches, there is no junior hockey.
