

Southern United Hockey Club President's 2022 Report

This year brought back the return of the uninterrupted hockey season.

Consistent with many other community sports, we initially struggled to field teams. However, with a lot of effort from our volunteers and coaches to encourage players to return, we were able to field 35 teams, with many making it to finals. This is an achievement worth celebrating.

The Club's efforts to secure a second hockey pitch at Farm Road continued to progress in 2022. The Council proposed concept plan to the community which included repurposing the cricket field to a new synthetic hockey pitch and opened a survey to hear community feedback. Over 400 survey responses were submitted, the majority from hockey and baseball players.

Following the results of the survey, Council has now decided it will construct a second hockey facility. However, there is a shortfall in funding which is still being reviewed by Council and will likely require advocacy from other levels of government, the club and/or Hockey Victoria. Thank you everyone who submitted a response to the survey, and encouraged their friends and family to also submit responses.

In late 2022, our club was fortunate to be the recipient of a \$75,000 grant for a new video scoreboard from the Victorian State Government through its Suburban Rail Loop Community Projects Fund. Thank you to Lindsay Smith and Steve Hoult for their efforts to secure this significant grant and their continued project management of the scoreboard installation process.

The SUHC community raised almost \$9,000 for the Peter MacCallum Cancer Foundation in 2022. This adds to the over \$80,000 in support we have raised for the Foundation in previous years. Thank you to our Life Member, Julian Pratt, for leading this fund-raising effort on behalf of the club.

A special thank you to our club and major sponsors: McKenzie's and Buxton Real Estate in Brighton. We are ever grateful for your significant financial contribution and continued support of SUHC. Their support is unwavering and it is a privilege to have their commitment.

Thank you to the 2022 Committee of Management: Helen Ward, Deb Ghuliani, Anna Jennings, Mark Storton, Steven Duffield, Suzie Styles and Ben Grant. This club is lucky to have such a committed group of people volunteering their time for the benefit of our community. A special thank you to outgoing Women's Section Head, Mark Storton. Mark joined the committee in June 2020 and since then led the women's section through COVID and the section's return to play. I have particularly valued Mark's support over this time and his ability to challenge the status-quo.

Finally thank you to all of SUHC's many volunteers: the coaches, the managers, the coordinators, the committee members, and the players. There is a lot of a tireless work that goes on behind the scenes and I am fortunate to witness it. Going forward, I hope more SUHC members continue to volunteer and ensure our club continues to enjoy the success it does, on and off the field.

I anticipate 2023 will prove to be another successful year for the club on and off the field. I know we will work hard to continue to offer an inclusive community for all of our members

Southern United Hockey Club – Treasurer's Report – 31 Dec 2022

Today I table to members the Special Purpose Financial Report for the year ended 31 December 2022. The report has been independently reviewed and was approved and adopted by the CoM.

Summary of Financial Results

I am pleased to report that following a full uninterrupted season, 2022 was financially very successful. With the P&L statement shows a surplus of \$53,595.

As I have mentioned in previous years, our on-field activities give rise to an operating loss on an annual basis and our financial success and stability is only possible due to the success of our retail operations – the canteen and the shop, general fundraising and the continued financial support of the Club's many sponsors. In particular we would like to thank the Club's sponsor McKenzies, to whom we are extremely grateful. Helen, not only are we grateful for the financial support from McKenzies but also for everything else you do for the Club. We would also like to acknowledge the continued support of our major sponsor, Buxtons Real Estate in Brighton - in particular, thank you to Ross Walker.

Our Statement of Financial Position (Balance Sheet) shows an increase in assets of \$93,358 mainly in the growth of our term deposits and current year earnings.

It is anticipated that our pitch will need to be re-surfaced in the next year or two which will significantly reduce our cash reserves but we are pleased to be in a position to have the reserves available to improve and hopefully expand our facilities for the benefit of our members.

Our liabilities are not material other than the Farm Rd Ground Replacement Fund which increases each year as a result of contractual arrangements between the Club and the Council. Our contribution to the Ground Replacement Fund is partially funded by 50% of the income the Council receives from Vodaphone phone tower. We have been advised by Council that Vodaphone have committed to a 9 year lease of the phone tower in 2018 which gives us some financial security for the next 4 years.

Peter Mac

Our Club members continue to raise much needed funds for Peter Mac which also resulted in raising valuable funds for the club. Over the years we have raised over \$100,000 for Peter Mac and in the year ended 31 December 2022, we raised nearly \$9,000.

Conclusion

Overall the Club is in a healthy financial position. However, we are reliant upon two major sponsors, our off-field retail operations and general fundraising activities to remain in this position. The CoM and a fundraising sub-committee is working on continuing to attract and maintain additional sponsors and encourage all members to bring any potential sponsorship opportunities to the attention of the CoM.
